My work captures nostalgic moments much like a personal diary that is always in motion, continuously evolving and unfolding. It encapsulates thoughts and records of an eternal, playful youth, bringing to life a sense of timelessness and carefree exuberance. This playful essence is hidden within minimal, almost imperceptible gestures, vulnerabilities, and impulses. These are the subtle aspects of ourselves that we typically conceal behind a protective shield in our everyday lives, masking them to fit societal norms and expectations. However, it is in moments of intimacy and personal connection that these true, unguarded expressions emerge. My art seeks to explore these hidden facets, inviting viewers to recognize and embrace their own concealed emotions and memories, allowing them to reconnect with the innocent, joyous spirit of their youth.



Vigía in Spanish means vigilance but it has a hidden root in the origin of the word associated with vigor and strength. This photozine is a visual exploration of the relationships between the body and the city, the city being a normalizing institution that appropriates our intimacy and the ruins on the edges.






Infraleves presents photographic and written records of fragilities and impulses, they are thoughts, longings and symptoms of a past that no longer exists and a future that is disconcerting. It is a present where forms are blurred and noise becomes louder, it is the gaze to a distance, the resound of an empty and meaningless echo in our ears, it is a sign of a wounded body, of the longing to return to the past and of that possibility that vanished. For Marcel Duchamp an "infraleve" is the vital matter of art, it is composed of those fragile events extracted from the contemplation of everyday life, it is a barely perceptible gesture that can reside in laughter, the fall of tears, the gestures of hands, glances and swirl or unruly hair.

The minimal, subtle gestures, the impulses and the fragilities of everyday life are captured in the photographs, leaving their traces and allowing us to seize a moment covered with an aura that conquers us and reminds us of the situations that have now turned into melancholy.




